The celebration was 10 months in the making with Kristen Fischer at the helm as the 90th Planning Committee Chairman. The committee included Jody Skelton, Stephanie Paine and about 16 alumni volunteers. There was also a decorations committee made up of alumni Lexi Haskell Hoffman, Jennifer Snow, Kate Dwyer and Kara Couture, who did everything from decorating the lodge with camp memorabilia to creating lovely lake centerpieces and pine & loon paper bag luminaries that lined the paths at night.

The weekend started with the annual Tri-Ath-Loon on Saturday morning

followed by awards and a barbecue. In the afternoon, all the activity areas were open and guests made the most of the beautiful weather, swimming, kayaking, walking the grounds, and taking boat rides with Peter King around the lake.

For an hour on the Craft Shop porch, Jody met with interested individuals to brainstorm the future of Huckins. The meeting generated a lot of great ideas about goals for camp, including the establishment of a new camp library.

Later in the afternoon, alumni and their guests attended smaller gatherings based on when they attended camp.



What ever happened to...

Sarah Daley Popescu

There is no equal to Camp Huckins' impact on my life. My name is Sarah Daley Popescu (aka "Pickle" to many a Nellie girl), and I attended camp from 1984-1995. From an early age, I knew Huckins was special. My mother, aunt and uncles were all Hucksters, and camp songs, stories and lore filled idle time on many a car trip. My experience as a camper was transformative, and I forged friendships that remain strong 30 years later. These friends are the girls who first noticed my sense of humor and never stopped laughing.

It was the summers I spent as a counselor and Small Crafts Director that first sparked an interest in education. When I decided to go back to

school and become a teacher, the unparalleled Huckins network helped me land my first job as a fifth grade teacher. Fifteen years later, I teach history at Greenwich Academy which brings me full circle, back to working with all girls.

I am forever thankful to Camp Huckins for the formative touchstones it provided. In moments of self-doubt, I reflect upon the persistence that helped me pass the outside area test and the courage I mustered to take out a Sunfish by myself for the first time. A few years ago, I found myself looking at a flat tire on a hot, rural roadside in Romania. Flustered, sweat dripping on the manual I was trying to "translate," I thought to myself, "It can't be more difficult than putting in the outside area floats during Pre-Early Bird Week," and quickly set to changing the tire. Feeling capable and confident is something Huckins fosters.

Today, I live in Connecticut with my husband and 7-year-old son. The highlight of my year is taking John to Mother-son Weekend. Every June, alongside some of my favorite grown-up Nellie girls, I get to watch John thrive in nature, make friends and get a glimpse of the Huckins spirit that sustained two generations before him. I don't think he will be nicknamed after a brined vegetable any time soon, but I can dream.




