The Program Lodge is the one building still in use today that holds many memories for our oldest alumni. Much has been done to add and renovate existing buildings at Camp Huckins over these many years, and now it is time to give the Program Lodge an update so future campers can continue to gather and make their own special memories.

Moving toward our 100th

CCYMCA Camp Huckins' centennial summer is on the horizon! Marking such a significant milestone inspires reflection on our history—the remarkable summer camp programs, the leadership development, the committed staff, volunteers and donors, and the beautiful grounds on the shores of Lake Ossipee. Preparing for our 100th also requires us to look toward the future to ensure our programs and facilities continue to be a place where families, individuals, and youth find joy, friendship, confidence, & belonging. How do we leverage our exceptional strengths to meet the changing needs of our campers, staff, and community?

The Huckins staff and Board of Directors have established 5 Strategic Priorities which are inspired by our history while also looking toward the future. The work guided by these priorities will position us to thrive as we enter our 2nd century. More information on the Strategic Priorities can be found on the Huckins website, CampHuckins.org.

1. Clarify & Commit to the CCYMCA Camp Huckins Experience & Purpose.

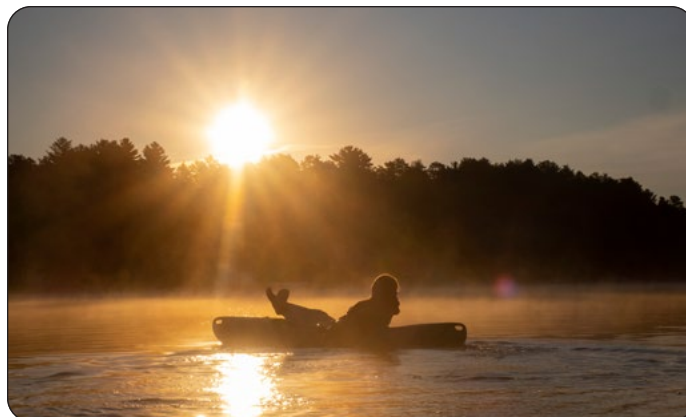
While aspects of the Huckins experience have changed over the last 95 years, many elements of the camp experience have remained constant and true. As we work to put our mission and vision into action and develop leaders within our community, we will work to identify the timeless elements of the Huckins experience that we will build upon. These elements will guide our decision making as we explore organizational and programmatic change and growth.

2. Grow and deliver safe, joyful Huckins Experiences for youth, families, individuals, and communities (campers, staff, volunteers, families, adults, alumni, donors, Carroll County stakeholders) that meet their changing needs.

When Samuel Huckins donated the land for Camp Huckins in memory of Nellie Harmon Huckins, he wrote, "Nothing but a living, pulsating institution can justly portray her personality." As a living institution, Huckins has adapted and innovated to deliver our mission throughout its history. We will continue to do the same as we mindfully grow and improve our **programs**, review our **traditions**, build a **culture of belonging**, and implement our **Master Plan** and **capital improvements**. We will approach all aspects of this work creatively and bravely, centering the Huckins Experience as we strive to serve our Huckins communities.

3. Re-Envision the Staff Experience.

Young people feel increasing pressure to build their resumes in support of their college applications and job searches. The expectations staff have of work have also



changed. Huckins is uniquely positioned to meet these changing needs and expectations as we re-envision the staff experience. We will leverage our history of investing in staff leadership development and the staff experience. We have a committed alumni network to support staff in their resume building and career development, framing the skills gained by working at Huckins to be competitive with summer internships. We will create a culture that nurtures mind, body, spirit, and joy for our staff.

4. Continue to develop understanding of Huckins Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, & Belonging strengths, shadows, and opportunities and bring that lens to all our work.

In the winter of my first year, I "zoomed" individually with the counselors and program staff. I asked each person to tell me their Huckins story. Although each was different, every person shared a similar anecdote – Huckins was the place where they felt a sense of belonging as their true self. It was remarkable and powerful, and this inspired us to strive to create that sense of belonging for all our campers and staff. We recognize this will be a continual process of individual and organizational learning, and unlearning. We will utilize outside resources and the perspectives of our Huckins community as we seek to integrate new knowledge into our programs and work.

5. Development and implementation of systems and tools that deliver our mission, build culture grounded in our core values, manage risks, and meaningfully engage staff, alumni, participants, families, donors, and community members.

To ensure the long-term health of CCYMCA Camp Huckins, we need to buttress our systems that protect the human, financial, capital, and natural resources of our organization. We will ground our work in the simplicity of life under the pines while acknowledging the increased complexity of camping and youth development.

What ever happened to... Amy (Shluger) Waryas?

I attended Camp Huckins from 1985-90, starting in the summer after 6th grade and finishing as an SC. Unlike most people, I didn't have a great first summer experience and wasn't sure I wanted to return. Everyone in my cabin that first year seemed to already know each other and I felt a bit like an outsider. My dad grew up going to camp and asked me to give it one more try because he knew how special the experience could be. I tried a different session the following summer and it ended up being one of the best decisions I ever made. If I had given up after that first year, not only would I have lost out on a childhood of wonderful summer memories, but my own children would likely never have gotten the incredible gift of camp that they are currently experiencing.

I graduated from Vanderbilt University in 1994 and started my career working in Human Resources. I have worked for a variety of companies and industries, but my current role is truly special. I lead the People & Culture team for The Boston Red Sox. This will be my 12th season and I have had the opportunity to be a part of two World Series wins and even have the championship rings from 2013 and 2018. Putting aside all the incredible work experiences I have been a part of the most special part of working for the Red Sox are the values the organization has and the people that I work with every day. Just like being at Huckins, the values and the people are what makes it special.

My husband, Keith, and I have been married for almost 20 years, and we have two children, Jackson (16), who

attends Belknap, and Caroline (13). Twenty-eight summers went by before I came back to Huckins after I left as an SC. I returned with Caroline, who wanted to see Huckins before signing up for her first summer. The minute I pulled into camp so many emotions came flooding back to me. Seeing Jody in the office for the first time after so many years brought unexpected tears to my eyes. In many ways, it felt like I had never left. There were so many familiar people and places that made me feel so connected. I even got to see Beth Coffey McKay, my W



counselor, while doing our tour. Caroline started at Huckins as soon as she finished 3rd grade, and this summer she'll be a lower senior. Seeing her hug her friends goodbye on pick up days brings all the emotions right back to the surface for me. I am so happy that both my children love camp as much as I did.

We also started going to Mother-Daughter weekend each year and it has become a wonderful tradition for the two of us to experience Huckins together. Driving up for that first Mother Daughter Weekend, I was a little nervous, not knowing if I would know anyone or what to expect. In true Huckins fashion, the very first person I saw when I got to camp was one of my closest friends from when I was a camper. 28 years later and it was like no time had even passed. In that moment, I felt so grateful to have reconnected with Huckins as it is always a place where everyone can belong and call home.

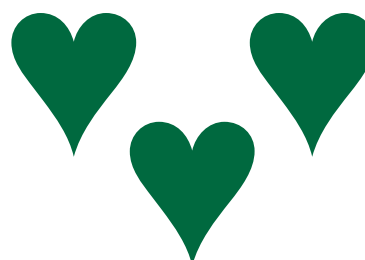

Land Acknowledgment

In our quest to learn the history of camp, we also sought to understand the history of the land camp sits on. We have found that the acreage that brings us all such joy is N'dakinna, the traditional ancestral homeland of the Abenaki Peoples past and present. We have learned this from our own Abby Burgess, who started as a camper in 2012, and has most recently been a counselor in Cabin D and Cabin S. She is member of the Bear Clan of Mi'kmaq First Nations and created a Land Acknowledgement in consultation with Abenaki leader, Art Hanchett. In 2022 we began sharing this at our first community gathering each session.

HUCKINS LAND ACKNOWLEDGMENT

We are continually learning about the history of Camp Huckins and the land that has been here for centuries before Camp came to be. To nurture our relationship with this land we must consider and honor those who lived and continue to live in harmony with it for centuries. In Freedom, this is the Abenaki people.

The following land acknowledgement reminds us that the ground beneath our feet does not necessarily belong to us, and subsequently we must remember our responsibility to love and respect the land.

Every community owes its existence and vitality to generations from around the world who contributed their hopes, dreams and energy to making the history that led to this moment. Some were brought here or removed against their will, some were drawn to leave their distant homes in the hope of a better life, and some have lived on this land for more generations than can be counted.

Mi'kmaq and Abenaki communities reside within the Algonquian families and have shared ecological knowledge. We have learned that in their medicine, pine is steeped in water to make a tea that cures colds. Blueberries are boiled and used for their anti-inflammatory effects, especially when treating arthritis. Sweet fern, leaves, twigs and all, are used to treat poison ivy rash.

When you see the pine trees, blueberry bushes and fern plants, think of the Abenaki who are still here living in areas of New Hampshire and Vermont. Furthermore, remember how land cannot and should not be commodified and how every individual has a responsibility to care for these resources and this beautiful land.

Camp Huckins is situated upon the ancestral and unceded lands of the Abenaki people. This acknowledgement reminds us of the significance of the place, the continued existence of Indigenous peoples, and our commitment to building respectful relationships with the Indigenous peoples who call these lands home today.

2022 Summary of Financial Position

The financial stability of Huckins reflects many things—our robust camp enrollment, the support of our Huckins community, and the careful stewardship of our resources by staff and the Board of Directors. Although the last two years have presented unique challenges programmatically and financially in re-opening camp, they have also inspired us to rethink systems and priorities. Now, we are looking toward the future, toward our 100th and beyond, from a position of strength.

The financial summaries that follow provide an overview of the investments being made in current program delivery, staff, capital improvements, and ongoing maintenance. These financial investments are advancing the organization's strategic priorities and ensuring we can continue to deliver high quality Huckins experiences.

The five-year review of Capital Investments demonstrates how priorities have changed and been informed by our learning in recent years. It also shows our organizational commitment to building on our strengths as we invest in our future. In 2023 we will begin updating our Master Plan with that same commitment and with an eye toward our centennial.

We are grateful for the over \$800,000 in gifts to Huckins in 2022—in support of the Huckins Fund, the Program Lodge Renovation, the Sports Complex, Scholarships, the Endowment Funds, and in honor of Jody's 51 years. Gifts to the Huckins Fund help cover operating expenses and financial aid, reducing pressure on tuition and supporting our goal to ensure cost is not a barrier to being a Huckins camper.

It is an exciting time for our organization and our Huckins community as we look toward our centennial. We will build on our rich history as we create a shared vision for the future, ensuring the generations that follow can experience the simplicity and joy of life under the pines. We look forward to engaging in this work together. Thank you for your support.

Letter from the Board Chair

Can you explain the way Huckins connects people? The examples are probably infinite. The friend who taught you to sail. The friends, recently retired, who reunited after many years and across many states for a road trip last summer. The friend, now in her 80s, who regularly calls her camp friend. The friends who ran into each other on the first day of their study abroad program. How can anyone distill these connections, alive well after time physically on the shores of Ossipee, into words? I've decided to simply marvel at each new example and focus on making sure these connections continue.

Listening to camp on change day tells us that these connections are being made. Walking through camp shows us the intention with which these connections are being fostered. So many gathering at camp in August demonstrated the joy in reunions, reconnection, and memories. The board is focused on providing our strong leadership team with the tools they need to nurture these connections. Part of our work involves using the disruption and rich teachings of the past few years to inform and propel us into the future.

The board gathered for a retreat on a beautiful October day to reflect upon the Huckins experience, focus on our strategic priorities, listen, and learn. Mark led an exercise in which each member of a group was given a photograph of a building made of blocks from different perspectives. No one could share their photo and instead each explained their perspective so the group could place the blocks to build what was pictured. The perspective sharing and trust in others required when everyone only has their own picture was the perfect exercise for the board's work—different expertise offered and trust enhanced to support Heather and the team as we build on our strengths.



Part of that strength involves board transitions. The board welcomed four new members at our last meeting. McCall Gosselin, Kara Ryan, Mike Whaland, and Chris Wong have brought their expertise and talents to buttress the current needs of the organization. Long-time members Ian Dowe, Eleni Eliades, Dick Fleming, and Karen Shackford cycled off the board at the end of 2022. They each gave tremendous gifts to the CCYMCA. Their contributions continue and it's been wonderful to see them still involved in committee work. Thank you. In addition, three officer roles transitioned. Kristen Brown was elected vice chair; Heather Lamberton, treasurer; and Sarah Guzman, secretary. All board members, everyone serving on board committees, and all of those who volunteer their time and talent to the CCYMCA deserve applause. Thank you.

Huckins will continue to do the work required to connect our young people with each other, and to foster connection between those already immersed in and those new to Huckins, with the wider Carroll County community, and with generations to come. Impactful Improvements

Capital Investments at Huckins

Summer 2022 saw a wide range of facility improvements and building renovations which enhanced the Huckins experience for campers and staff.

Renovations to the Sports Complex transformed the space into a hub for staff. They utilized the various spaces around the clock—from working out in the gym before breakfast, to pick-up sports in the evening, to board games and conversations on the mezzanine. The clearing of trees between the Sportfield and the Complex opened up the central part of camp, creating a feeling of connectedness between the Archery Range and the Courts. Group conversation was a constant on the mezzanine, while folks enjoyed taking in the views across the Sportsfield or watching the court from the “gallery view.” Improved Wi-Fi allowed staff to stay connected and complete any necessary fall-related school projects.

A cabin built in the Middler Division resulted in a new, innovative approach to the evolving staffing puzzle. This cabin was designated for Divisional Senior Counselors (Divisional SCs), counselors who could rotate into cabins to support as needed. The additional cabin also helped during fourth session when Jr. Junior Counselors (JJC)s moved in. These JJC)s were July CITs invited back to support counselors during session four. They brought a boost of energy to the staff team to help us finish strong. As part of our commitment to improving the staff experience, renovation of staff housing units continued in 2022. Three bungalows were fully refurbished, and all bungalows received new furniture. The remaining bungalows will be renovated by summer 2023.

Our food program accounts for one of the biggest parts of campers and staff's day. Our community gathers 3 times

a day, every day, in the Dining Hall to be fueled by nutritious food, connect with peers, and sing on tables! As a result, we remain focused on improving the facility and developing the experience for all in our community. This past season we utilized a dining hall tent to create added space. This connected directly to the west wing of the building, allowing carts to move easily, and bringing us closer to that feeling of all being together in one Dining Hall. This was made possible with a concrete slab, completed in May, which was the floor for the tent. This slab was designed so that it will now serve as the foundation for a 60' by 50' Dining Hall addition, which will be completed for summer 2023.

As we look ahead in our Master Planning, we will continue to focus on improvements that will have a positive impact on camper, family, and staff experiences, and that will advance our Strategic Priorities.

Stepping Up for Community Need

Freedom Elementary School has been visiting Camp Huckins for their annual end of school Field Day in June for many years. At last year's event, while students were swimming and playing, conversations began between Huckins and the school administration about the need for after-school programming for their families. Some months later, with the arrival of Katie Miressi in the newly created Community Programs Coordinator role, Huckins knew it was time to explore ways we might fill the gap and support Freedom families.

In September, a feasibility assessment was completed with local families to gauge interest, grant funding was explored, and the program development began. The response from families was clear –if we built it, students would come! The school board approved the program and funding was secured. The program launched in November 2022 and operates 3 days per week. Up to 20 students (about 40% of the school's population) can now be enrolled in the program each session. All sessions thus far have taken place at the school, and the Spring 2023 session will involve daily trips to Huckins to engage in outdoor, camp-based activities.

The program consists of group games, weekly projects, free choice time, physical activity, homework time, a healthy snack, and outdoor play while fostering positive relationships between peers and staff members. A different hands-on project is offered every week, allowing the students to express their creativity and take their accomplishments home. Students have especially loved using modeling clay and their creations are truly amazing! They choose from a variety of age-appropriate games, STEM toys, and art supplies during their free time.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS SNAPSHOT

Squeaky Sneakers A program for children aged 18 months-3 years and their caregivers, focused on motor skill development, coordination & socialization skills, and learning through play and creativity. Over 25 families attended programs offered in North Conway throughout the year.

New Hampshire YMCA Youth & Government 18 students from Kingswood Regional High School and Moultonborough Academy participated in this mock legislative program held in the New Hampshire State House.

Senior Sneakers 9 participants attended chair exercise class or walking group.

Freedom Soccer 26 students participated in this Fall program offering.

Teambuilding for Local Schools Hosted over 550 local children from 5 different schools across the County with teambuilding, low ropes, and camp activities.

Freedom After School Program Over 250 hours of programming were provided to students in December.

Freedom Village Store Donated the venue for the Store's annual fundraising auction, held in August at the Camp Huckins Dining Hall.

In addition to our daily snack, the biggest highlight of the week is when Chef Joel comes with his food activity! Once a week Joel brings different ingredients from which the kids get to build, design, and then eat their own snack. The kids have made fruit sculptures, rice cake animals,



decorated holiday cookies, participated in an apple tasting and more! We are so lucky that he has been able to share his expertise with us and provide great food for the students.

Huckins has been honored to partner with Freedom Elementary

school to offer and deliver this much needed program in the community. Huckins is currently working with the school district and exploring other funding sources to help sustain this program into the 2023-2024 school year.

HUCKINS DONATIONS TO THE FREEDOM FOOD PANTRY

Donations of non-perishable food from our camper sessions and pre & post season groups allowed us to provide the Freedom Food Pantry with 835 food items over the course of the summer. The Food Bank expressed their gratitude for our ongoing support, sharing that "without your help we would be unable to provide such healthy nutrition to so many who depend on us" and that "your compassion has helped to ease the burden of our area families who continue to struggle with inflation and rising costs of food and other household goods." They asked us to "kindly extend our deepest thanks to each and every one who has contributed to support our local families in need."

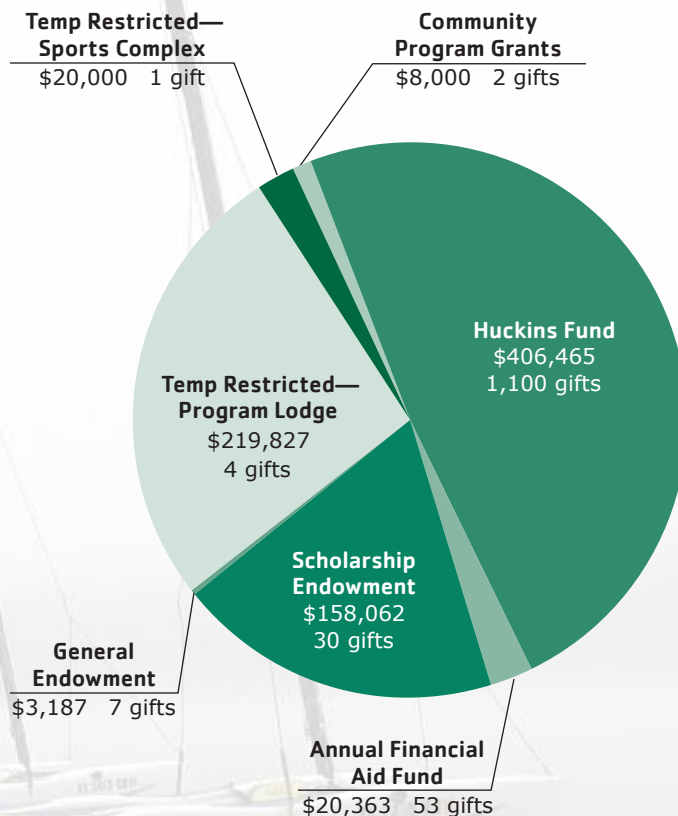
